



After almost a year in Maxixe we move 700km north to a road junction.

Cruzamento De Tete (crossroads to Tete) is 20km from the city of Chimoio and 70km from the Zimbabwe border. Actually we can't move there yet by the because there is no where to live! Some money given by Methodist Church Britain (MCB) has been allocated to build a church house. Despite delays due to bureaucracy, building has now begun with hopeful completion by March. But





this is dependent on money being available for a borehole and fitting out the interior not to mention working around the rains. Rains came very late this year... but having come they came with vengeance! so much so that during the final packing the ceiling came down in our Maxixe home.... right over a bed and our books..packed and ready to move. The room soon flooded, but thanks to the lady who helps around the house we managed to move the sodden boxes with minimal damage to furniture and books.

A big logistical problem.. where do you get a covered lorry... especially one which will protect books, furniture, mattresses and precious items agains the rain. Answer... forget the idea... no business person is interested in making the trip not least because of the bad roads and travelling through a former conflict zone which until September 2014 could only be traversed in an military escorted convoy.

# A good samaritan lent me a trailer ... and a friend introduced me to the owner of an open truck

Having concluded that a least two return trips would be needed towing a trailer, I was pleased when the truck eventually arrived in the evening and loaded most of our belongings like giant three dimension jigsaw over two metres high. A flimsy tarpaulin then covered them overnight ready for the next days journey northward. After a round trip of over a hundred km to take the driver to his home to sleep, return the trailer and collect a United Methodist Pastor from a police roadblock, we slept.

## Travelling behind the lorry was nerve racking!

We eventually arrived at the Circuit Stewards home at midnight... only one rain downpour which was fortunate because the plastic tarpaulin offering ended up in shreds flying past Malcolm in the car following the lorry soon after leaving Maxixe. So in the early hours we unload the lorry into a storeroom... which was just as well as it rained heavily just as we finished. God is good!

## **Answers to Prayer**

On the 6th day of each month in the UK Methodist handbook, people are invited to hold us in their prayers. Looking back over the past year we sense God has been answering prayer.

1. Developing Medical Outreach

Last year the District appointed Revd Arlindo Munduma to be a mission Partner in Nampula. ..and we understand Methodist Church Britain have allocated \$7000 for Arlindo to be paid as a National in Mission Appointment. We understand money for accommodation and transport is still panded.
