## The Revd Dr Martyn D Atkins

In 2015 the Revd Dr Martyn Atkins completes seven years as the Secretary of the Conference and General Secretary of the Methodist Church.

Martyn came to this role with an international reputation as a missiologist, academic, preacher, and liturgist. His previous experience included a variety of different roles in which he utilised his gifts and graces on behalf of the Church. These included circuit ministry, schools chaplaincy, being Principal of Cliff College and being President of the Conference for 2007-8.

In his time as Secretary of the Conference and General Secretary, Martyn has been a key protagonist in amplifying what the Connexion was saying as it grappled with immense changes both inside and outside the Church. An early focus on 'Holiness and Risk' brought together Methodists from around the Connexion to declare together that God was indeed not finished with the Methodist Church and resulted in a renewed calling to mission and discipleship which was to be the main focus for Martyn's leadership. The benefits of this focus have been seen around the Connexion and the Church is stronger, more courageous, more visionary, as a result of hearing God's call through the focus of becoming 'a discipleship movement shaped for mission'.

This impact has been felt throughout global Methodism. Martyn has forged stronger links with a variety of Methodist bodies throughout the world and in particular further developed existing bonds with The United Methodist Church.

Martyn has been a strong and patient leader, helping to guide the Church through difficult choices in the hope of building a better tomorrow for the people called Methodist. His passion and commitment for the Kingdom has opened up new avenues of exploration for the Church whilst nurturing established and valued relationships.

Throughout the last seven years Martyn has given of himself unstintingly to help the Methodist Church to discern and bear witness to its purpose under God, its calling and its priorities.

The Conference expresses its deep gratitude for all that Martyn is and all that he has given, and wishes him and Helen well for the future.
